ROCKCLIMBING ADVENTURE

Start out the week with a full day of High Cope Experience 60' to 80' feet up in the pines, on a 100' cable walk, or giant's ladder, then rappel down and climb a caving ladder to a 200' ZIP Line. Learn team work, safety, climbing procedures by doing.

Then backpack to a mountain meadow, set up camp for 4 days of real rockclimbing, not on some wooden wall, but real Sierra granite, with a 4,000 view of Mono basin behind you as you learn from experienced climbers. Advisors can even end up with the Climb Leader Certification.

Return for your last night, and soak out the kinks in our hot tub.



HIGH MOUNTAIN ICE AND SNOW ADVENTURE

Start out the week with like the rockclimbing adventure with a full day of HIGH Cope, to get adjusted to the altitude, and build teamwork, and trust. ZIP Lines, belaying, and fun, with certified, and experienced instructors every step of the way.

Then backpack to a glacier basin with snow and ice surrounding 4 mountain lakes leading up to a 12,400 mountain peak. Learn to use a mountaineers tools, like ice axes, crampons, snow flukes and climbing ropes on a real 5,000 year old glacier. Glissade down snow slopes hundreds of feet long, and be in control. Soak up the sun in the afternoon to warm up and fish for native trout in mountain stream. Our mountain guides will help every step of the way.

SIERRA MOUNTAIN MAN ADVENTURE

For your team, or troop or just for you as part of a provisional unit. Seven days of backpacking and mountain experiences including peak bagging three peaks, all over 11,000 feet, rockclimbing, High Cope. A trained staff will help you along, and help train in backpacking skills. All this in the Sierra Nevada along side Yosemite National Park.

BACKPACK ADVENTURES

18 unique trips, all planned out, with profiles, mileage, food provided and a Mountain Guide to be a resource along the way. 4 day trips range from 10 or 15 mile hikes to strenuous 50 milers, all one the Eastern side of Yosemite.

For Example try:

10 LAKES FISHING ADVENTURE: 15 miles and ten Sierra lakes and streams to fish in and we'll even teach you to fly fish along the way.

GRAND CANYON OF THE TUOLEUME: Hike from the meadows on the Eastern side of Yosemite into some the deepest valleys in the Sierra,

YOSEMITE VALLEY RIM: Walk the southern rim of Yosemite valley and see water falls from the top and look down 1000s of feet. Most people look up and never see the grandeur of the valley below. Something about you can't see the forest... on this trip you will see the forest from above and a lot more. You'll see from the ocean to Nevada!!!

PEAKBAGGERS DELIGHT: 5 peaks all over 11,500'. Start out easy the first day with Mono Dome at 11,000 and then Lee Vining at 11,500 and Warren at 12,000. and keep going up and away

Log Cabin Wilderness Camp, the Los Angeles Area Council's high adventure base in the eastern Sierra Nevada, twelve miles from Yosemite National Park.

Our High Country Gateway and Sierra Nevada Mountain Man programs offer a high adventure experience like none other in the world. Your crew can hike through the mountains that John Muir called "the range of light." You can climb mountains over 12,000 ft. high. You can stand at the top of the highest waterfall in America and photograph the same scenes as Ansel Adams.

In the Gateway program, you will hike through the second oldest national park in the U.S. and while it is one of the most visited, your chances of seeing more than a dozen people are remote.

The Mountain Man program will teach your crew technical climbing and belaying and how to work together as a team to achieve their final goal of standing atop 13,325 ft. Mt. Warren.

Custom Program is designed to meet your troop's desired program. Price varies depending on the items and program your unit chooses. Arrival / departure meals & food for the trail is provided along with trail maps. C.O.P.E. & Climbing programs, tentage, stoves, water purification and staffing needs are available upon request.
