New Frontier Challenge

STUFF YOU NEED TO KNOW

DATE: Saturday, 1 February 2014

CAMPING: Camping available evening of Jan. 31ST and Feb 1st – reserve cabin or tentsite with Peoria Park District by calling Camp Wokanda at (309) 579-2157 or Forest Park Nature Center at (309) 686-3360

PLACE: Camp Wokanda, 620 E Boy Scout Rd, Chillicothe, IL 61523

DIRECTIONS: Available on Google by typing Camp Wokanda, Peoria

COST: The registration fee for each Scout/Adult is \$10.00 if registration is received on or before Friday, 17 Jan, 2014. After Jan. 17, ALL fees will be \$14.00 / person. Fee covers event patches (possibly on knit cap), awards, program and lunch supplies, & council required liability insurance.

CAMPING OPTIONS: (Contact park district early for best choices)

- Ridge Cabins (capacity 20) wood floors, bunk beds, electricity, wood stoves, outdoor fire ring, outhouses. Cost: \$95/weekend
- Valley Cabins (capacity 12) concrete floors, bunk beds, electricity, wood stoves, close to
 Wokanda's restroom and shower facility. Cost: \$65/weekend
- o Group Camp Sites (capacity 10) hand washing facility and outhouses. Cost: \$30/weekend
- Adirondacks (capacity 12 3 Adirondacks 4/unit) open on one side with wood floors in more remote part of camp – pack in required Cost: \$25/weekend

HEALTH AND MEDICAL RECORD: THE BSA "Annual Health and Medical Record" Parts A & B must be completed and turned in at registration by all Scouts and adults. EVERYONE attending the Klondike Derby must have a Medical Record at Check-In.

PEORIA PARK DISTRICT LIABILITY WAIVER: EVERYONE attending the Klondike Derby must have a signed waiver at Check-In.

LUNCH: Troop Leaders are asked to prepare a dutch oven or soup pot hot meal that they can submit for the cooking competition and to contribute to a "potluck" lunch. The event will provide crackers/bread, bowls, utensils, and drinks for each registered Scout and adult. Any meals before or after the event (for those camping) you must provide and prepare on your own.

DRESS WARM: Warm winter boots, layered clothing, gloves, and hats are essential. This is an ALL-DAY OUTDOOR event in February, so watch the forecast and dress appropriately. If you are camping, review cold weather camping information in the Scout Handbook, Fieldbook, and other resources.

AWARDS: Patrols will be scored based on their performance at each of the Klondike Derby stations. Awards will be given to the top patrol for each station. Nuggets will also be awarded for patrols that camp, lash

their sled on site, successfully respond to claim jumpers (will be good to know Scout to First Class skills), and decipher coded messages. Leaders can add to the patrol gold cache by participating in the cooking competition. An overall Klondike 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place award will be presented potentially giving you bragging rights for the next year.

KLONDIKE DERBY CHALLENGES

DAWSON CITY - FIRST AID

Travelers up North are subject to severe weather conditions as well as accidents and sickness on their journey for gold. Those who are unprepared may perish. Your First Aid knowledge and skills may help you save someone in distress.

ANVIL CREEK – FIRE BUILDING & COOKING

The Prospectors were good at making and using tools that would help them get a fire started in rough conditions. Char cloth was a common fire aid of their day. Bring your own and demo you know how to use it to win the most gold.

The prospectors had never heard of Aunt Jemima or Bisquick. They had sacks of flour and salt, cans of lard and when really fortunate, maybe some cans of condensed milk in their chuckboxes. And those are the ingredients you'll have available at the Juneau station. You might want to brush up on a recipe to stir together some flapjacks.

CHILKOOT PASS AERIAL TRAMWAY- TEAMWORK

At Chilkoot, you'll have to work as a team to get your patrol and gear across this pass.

BONANZA CREEK - PANNING FOR GOLD

GOLD! That's what you're here for, and that's what you'll find in this teamwork challenge. Work together for the greatest rewards!

WHITE PASS – LUMBERJACK GAMES

Some basic jumberjacking skills and a well balanced team will help you succeed at White Pass

NOME – TURKEY SHOOT

Prospectors get hungry, but wild game is plentiful out here on the tundra IF you know where to look and you're a sharp marksman. Bag more turkeys and win more gold...it's as simple as that!

CIRCLE CITY – GOLD TRANSPORT

In this team event, you'll have to work together with other prospectors to move some gold in a rather unconventional manner.

YUKON RIVER - FISHING DERBY

With your pole effectively lashed together, you are sure to drop your hook into the best fishing holes in the river.

WHITE HORSE RAPIDS RIVER CROSSING

Can you get a team member across the river dry with three sticks, some twine, and 4 ropes? We'll test your ability to work as a team in this fun and challenging event

THE GREAT SLED RACE!

Weather permitting there will be two races! The first is a lap around the field with a team of dogs (Scouts) and an empty sled; the second time your Scoutmaster (or his designated substitute) goes along for the ride. Who's gonna be the champion this year...?

Appendix A – Sled Station Rules

Note: Troops can participate in Klondike with pre-made sleds but will forfeit the gold nuggets that can be earned at the Sled Building Station. Point values yet to be determined but points for this station will be comparable to the other stations at Klondike

Rule 1: Only Boy Scouts allowed in Sled Building Area

Rule 2: Patrols are encouraged to bring everything they will need to build their sled. Wokanda might offer many natural materials, but they will be very difficult to find on Friday night in the dark.

Rule 3: To attain maximum points, only manufactured items allowed as part of Klondike sled are set of skis (can be screwed to two pole runners) and bucket of twine. For maximum points, all other sled materials should be of the kind you can find naturally in the woods.

Rule 4: No wheels, wagons, plastic sleds

Rule 5: Not a timed event. Patrols can work on their sleds in established sled building areas up until 10:00 PM Friday evening. Sleds must be presented for evaluation Saturday between 8-9 AM.

Scoring: Sleds will be evaluated and graded based on composition and quality of lashings.

Appendix B – Cooking Competition

Rule 1: Only Scout Leaders over 18 allowed to enter the competition

Rule 2: Entries must be entered clearly marked with Cooks Name and Troop/Patrol they are supporting.

Troops may have multiple entries..

Rule 3: Entries must include the recipe listing all ingredients and instructions - recipes to be collected and disseminated after the event – recipes needed to allow anyone with allergies to know what is in the dish

Rule 4: Meal must be cooked on site in campsites and brought to dining hall prior to judging time.

Rule 5: Dutch Oven or One Pot Meals.

Category: Main Dishes

Bonus Category: Breads, Desserts (requires main dish entry to enter)

Scoring: Dishes will be evaluated and graded based on taste, appearance, practicality as camp meal, and creativity.
